

## Little Feet, Big Dreams Capital Fundraising Campaign

A \$5.8 million project approved by voters in 2011 provided for renovations and construction of new classrooms and multipurpose room at North Park Elementary. The project was necessary to better meet the educational needs of our students in Broken Bow. However, the funding fell short of providing some very important equipment and finished recreational facilities at the school.

The Little Feet, Big Dreams Capital Fundraising Campaign aimed for completion of four projects:


Project #1: Flooring and Gym Equipment for the Multipurpose Room (\$77,574)

Project #2: Two sets of Playground Equipment (\$99,674)

Project #3: Bleachers for the Multipurpose Room (\$10,234)

The Little Feet, Big Dreams Capital Fundraising Campaign raised \$205,000 to fund these projects and now our sites are set on Project #4.

Sixteen years ago, seed money was donated by Col. Marchek of Broken Bow for a Performing Arts facility. Talk of how to accomplish this has continued through the years but now is the time to take action—to plant that seed—and watch it grow. A new Performing Arts facility will benefit the Fine Arts students at Broken Bow Schools, as well as the community, for generations to come.

The proposed plan calls for the new Performing Arts facility to be attached to the existing High School and will seat 500 people.

The estimate for this building is \$4.2 million.
